

The Museum of Flight Costume Policy for All Ages Events

The Museum of Flight's Costume Policy provides guidelines for staff, volunteers, Museum guests, individuals and groups who wear a costume for seasonal celebrations or as part of an all-ages Museum event.

The goal of the Costume Policy is to ensure that costumes worn on Museum property are safe and not offensive in a family-friendly environment. Costumes should add to a positive guest experience.

The following guidelines apply to costumes worn on Museum property during an all-ages event:

- 1. Costumes must be family-friendly.
- 2. Costumes must not include political themes or messaging
- 3. Must fit through a standard doorway (under 85.5" tall \times 35" wide).
- 4. No pyrotechnics, fire, smoke, steam, fog, helium balloons, or glitter.
- 5. No nudity, body paint as clothing, lewd content, or overly revealing outfits.
- 6. No real or replica weapons, except replica swords that are securely attached and can't be drawn. All costume weapons are subject to inspection—refusal may result in removal from the event.
- 7. Photo ID may be required for costumes that cover the face.

The Museum of Flight reserves the right to refuse entrance to the Museum if the costume is deemed inappropriate or distracting, as determined by The Museum of Flight staff.
